






TOTAL RIDERSHIP - BUS, STREETCAR, PARATRANSIT & FERRY:




On-Time Performance | Bus, Streetcar & Paratransit




BUS ON-TIME PERFORMANCE BY ROUTE






STREETCAR ON-TIME PERFORMANCE BY ROUTE



ON-TIME PERFORMANCE STREETCAR: All streetcar lines saw an increase in OTP for the month of June.



TOTAL BUS SERVICE DELIVERY


TOTAL STREETCAR SERVICE DELIVERY






RIDERSHIP & OTP COMPARISON ROUTES 3 - 66





PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE COMPLIANCE Bus, Streetcar, and Paratransit: Bus experienced a 3% increase, however, streetcar decreased by 10% from the previous month. There was a 19% increase in paratransit compared to the previous month.






STREETCAR FLEET AVAILABILITY: This month staff changed the way we are viewing streetcar availability; it has been split by car type for a better overview of service types.




FIXED ROUTE AND PARATRANSIT FLEET OVERVIEW JUNE 2023



Bus and Paratransit Fleet Availability: Bus experienced a 4-bus decrease in bus availability, the agency also had to retire two buses in June due to accidents and frame damage. Paratransit decreased by 1 from the previous month.

ROAD CALLS PER 100K MILES I JUNE 2023



ROAD CALL MILEAGE: Fixed Route bus had 2-failure increase at 12.23, with a goal of 13. Streetcar had a 4-failure increase at 6.6, with a goal of 5. Paratransit had a .5-failure increase at 1.5, with a goal of 5 for chargeable mechanical road failures per 100,000 for the month of June 2023.








2023 Strategic Mobility Plan Update Board of Commissioners Operations & Administration Committee August 2023



What is the Strategic Mobility Plan (SMP)?

- A roadmap for improving public transportation in the region for the next 20 years.
- Provides direction for the RTA by describing:
 - Core mission and vision
 - 6 Goals each with objectives, strategies
 - 129 Action with target timeframes
 - Measure and targets to track progress
- Adopted by Board in 2018








How was the SMP Created?

- Developed through a yearlong planning process in 2017
- Top community priorities in the plan:
 - Improved access to destinations
 - Fast, frequent service
 - Better regional connections
 - Improved public perception of transit
 - More late-night bus and ferry service
 - More ADA accessibility
- The 2018 input and community priorities remain the foundation of the 2023 SMP update

A complete planning process will be initiated in 2026 as part of next update







How does RTA use the SMP? Recent Examples



SH1: By 2020, begin incorporating low or no emission vehicles into new vehicle acquisitions and vehicle replacement cycles

2021: Applied for FTA Grant to pilot electric buses.

2022: Awarded grant

2023: Completed analysis and procurement

2025: 3 buses and charging equipment in service

2023: Submitted & awarded grant for:

- 20 electric buses
- Charging infrastructure
- 5MW Microgrid
- Workforce development

2026: 20 buses delivered for annual replacement



CO6: By 2020, complete a new Comprehensive Operations Analysis (COA) with recommendations for a <u>network redesign</u> and capital needs for implementation.

CO7: By 2022, finalize implementation of network redesign

2019: RPC completes COA and bus network redesign "New Links Plan"

2022: RTA completed network redesign implementation







Why are we updating the SMP?

- Long-range plans must be regularly updated to stay relevant
- A lot has happened at the RTA and in the Greater New Orleans region
 - RTA transition to fully public organization
 - Major shocks to agency Hard Rock Collapse, COVID-19, Hurricane Ida
 - Significant RTA accomplishments
- 2023 update is not a comprehensive re-plan but a refresh to reflect these changes
