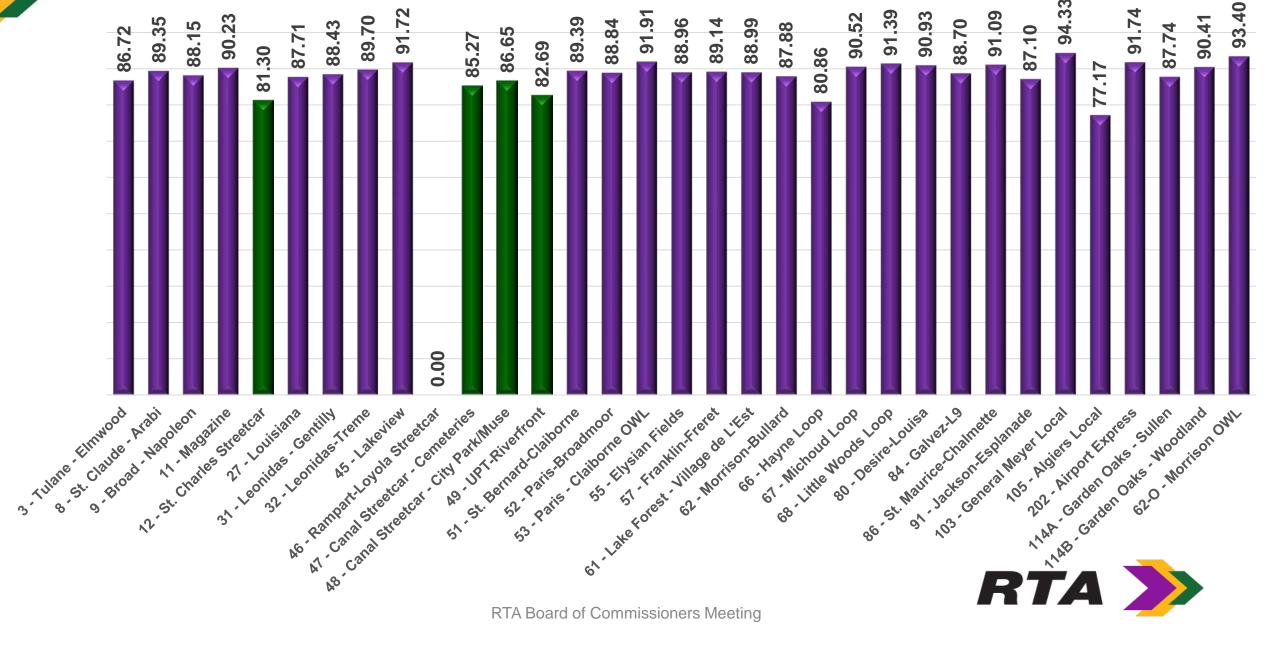

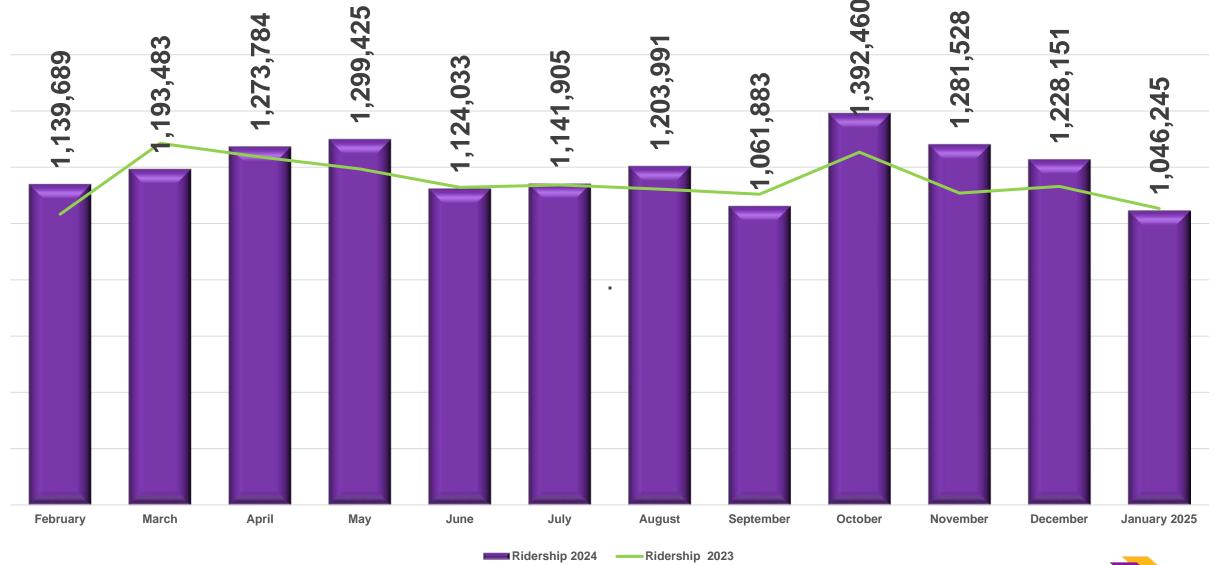

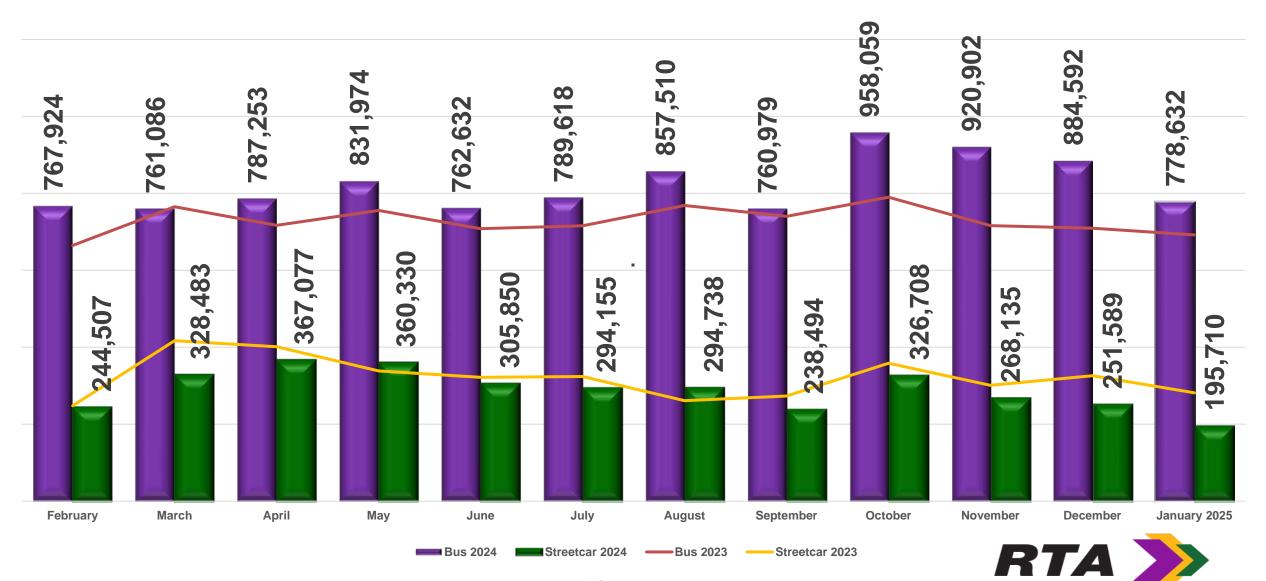


TOTAL RIDERSHIP - BUS, STREETCAR, PARATRANSIT & FERRY

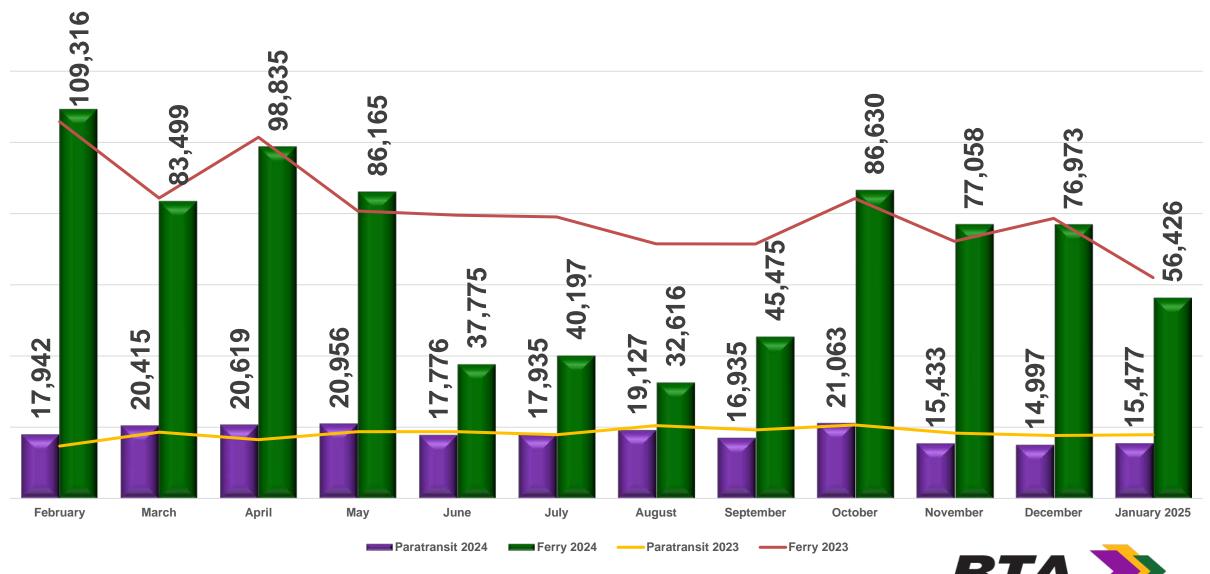




RIDERSHIP - BUS & STREETCAR | JANUARY 2025



RIDERSHIP - PARATRANSIT & FERRY | JANUARY 2025

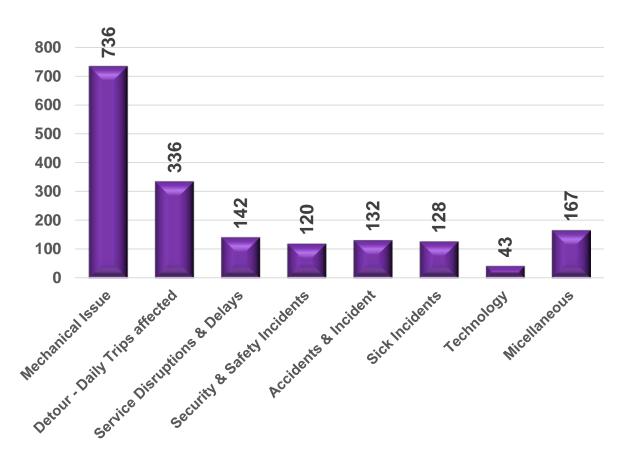


LONG-TERM DETOURS AFFECTING ALL MODES

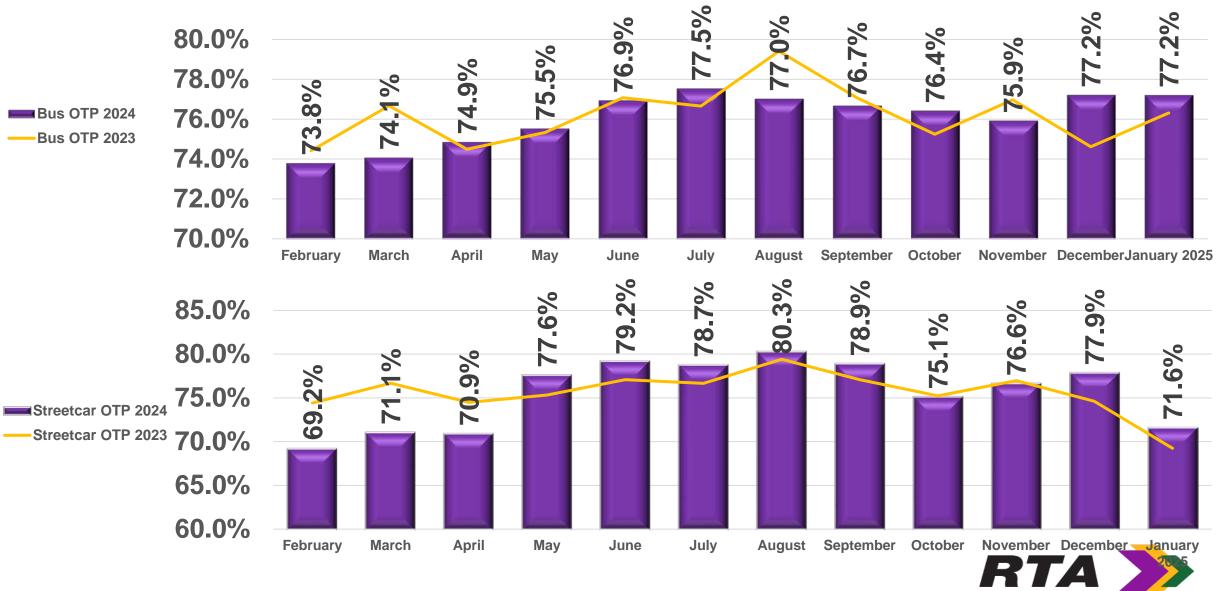

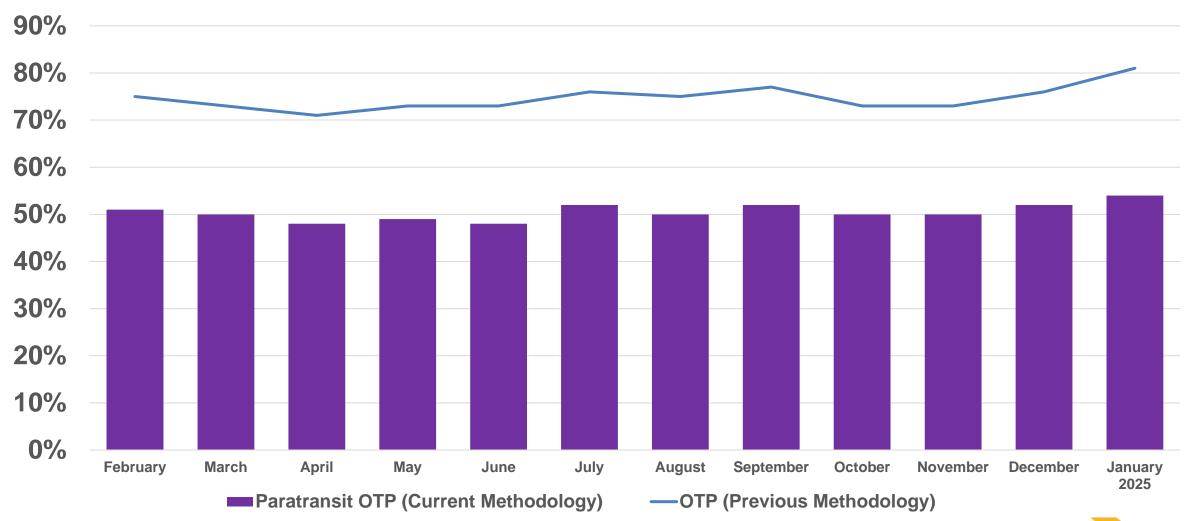

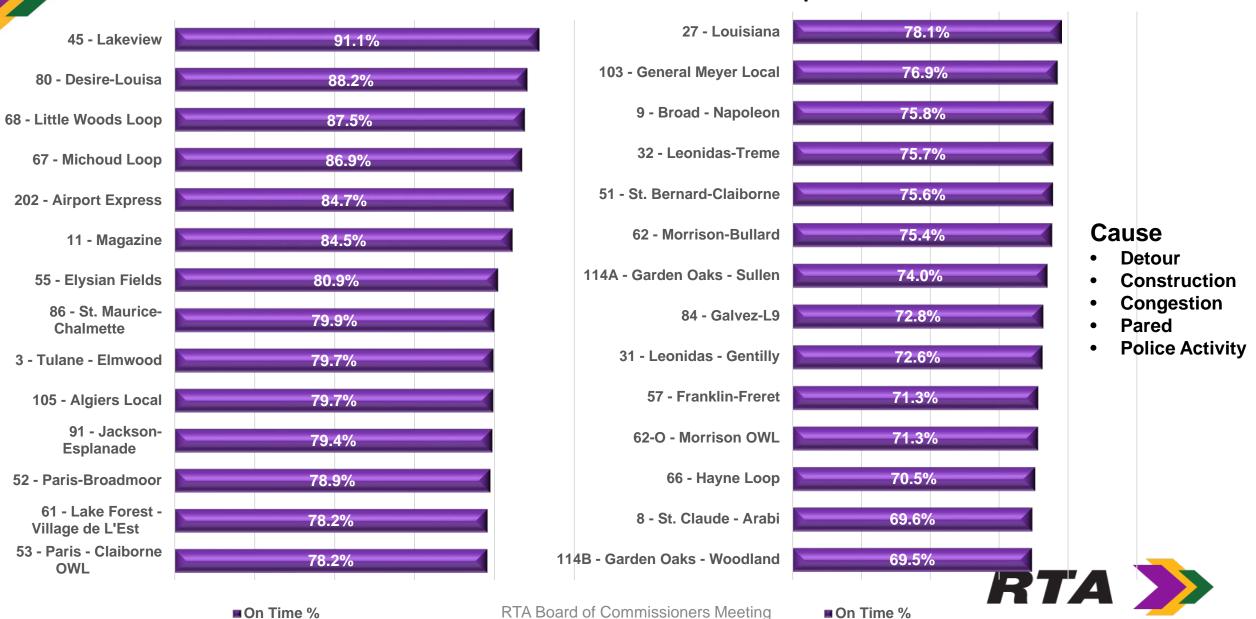
ON-TIME PERFORMANCE – BUS, STREETCAR | JANUARY 2025



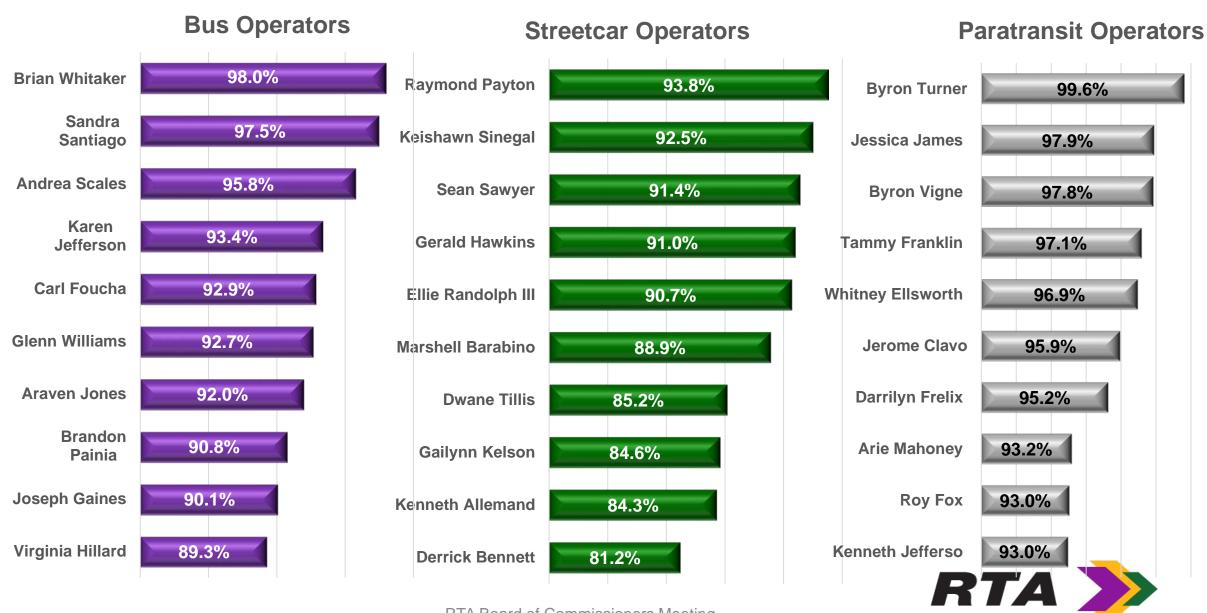
ON-TIME PERFORMANCE - PARATRANSIT | JANUARY 2025

TOP ON-TIME PERFORMER BY MODE | JANUARY 2025



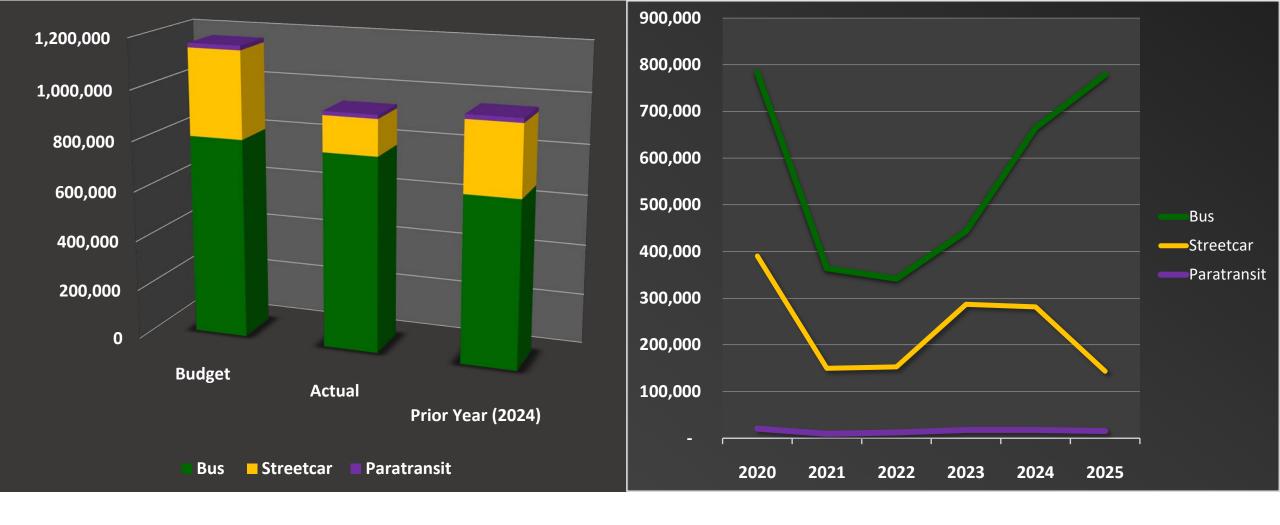

Ridership

Ridership in January decreased by 18.5% when compared to December 2024 actuals. In January, total system ridership (bus, streetcar and paratransit) was 938K, compared to 1.2M for the previous month of December.





Farebox Recovery Rates 2025 vs. 2024

Fare revenue continues to offset a modest percentage of operating expenses as ridership continues to rebound. January's farebox recovery rate decreased from 8.5% to 7.6%, a decrease of 0.9%

FERRY- Farebox Recovery Rates 2025 vs. 2024

The decrease in farebox recovery to 6.2% in January from 6.7% in December is the result of a decrease in operating expenses and a decrease in fare revenues from the prior month. Fare revenues continue to offset a small percentage of operating **RTA** costs.

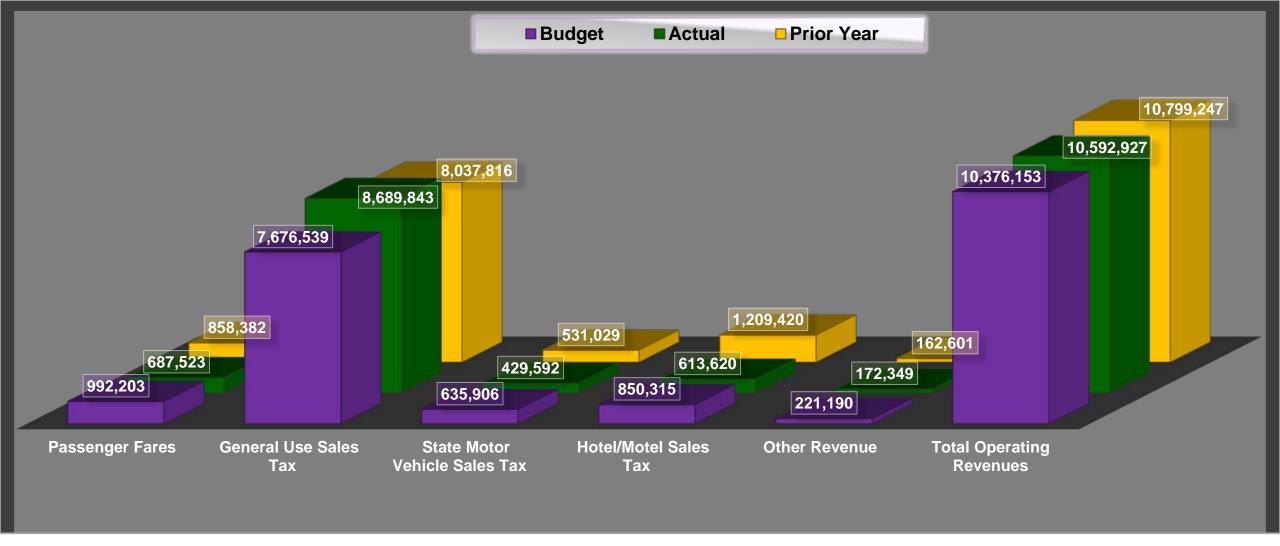

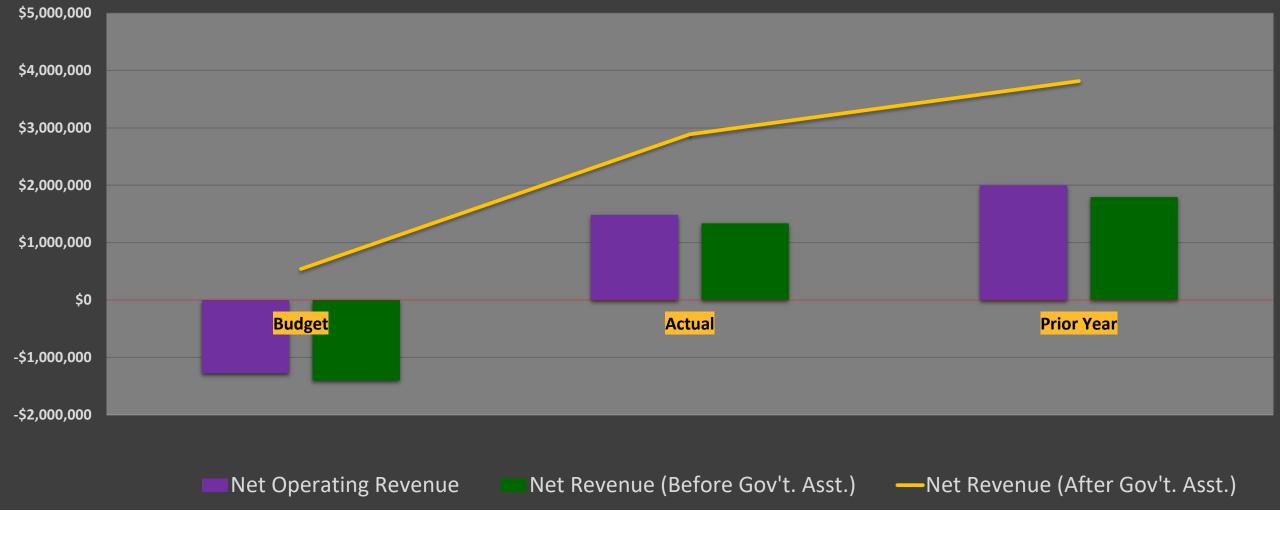




Operating Revenues (Budget, Actual & Prior Year)

RTA's two largest revenue sources are General Use Sales Tax (\$8.7M) and Passenger Fares (\$688K). The two combined make up 88.5% or \$9.4M of total revenue. Overall, total operating revenues for the month of January are \$10.6M.





Net Revenues (Before and After Government Assistance)

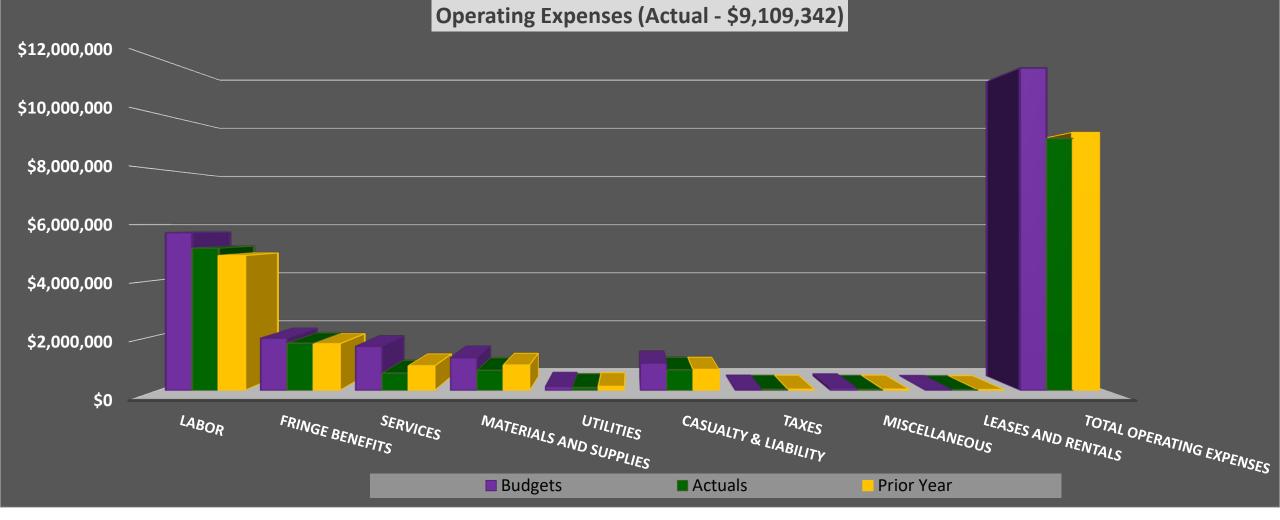
Net Revenue (Before Government Assistance) is \$1.3M for the month of January. After applying the month's \$1.7M in Government Operating Assistance, Net Revenue is \$2.9M for the month of January.

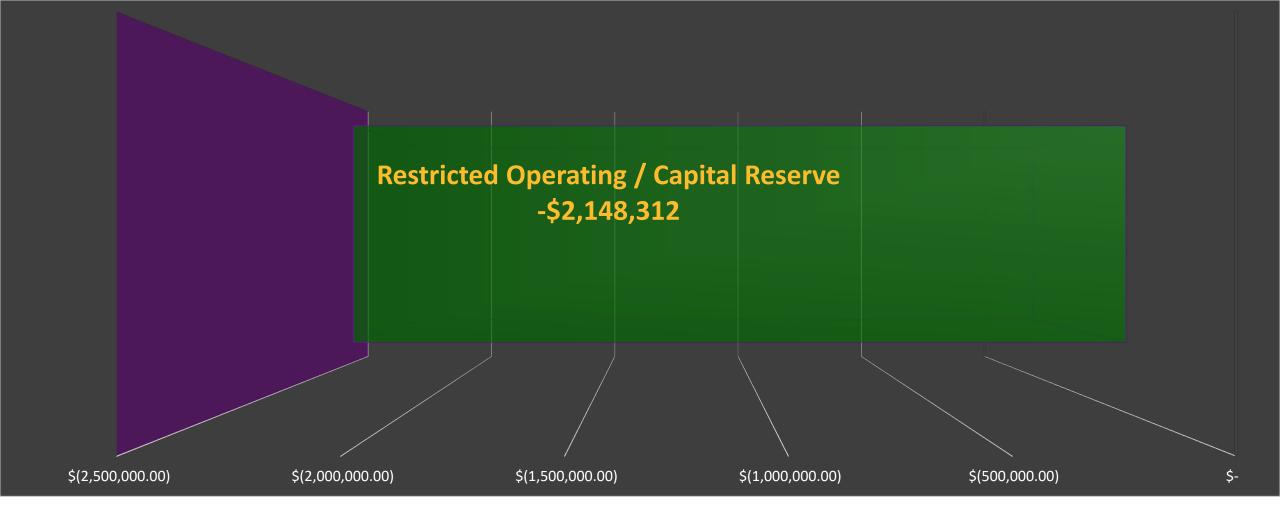

Operating Expenses

Operating Expenses for the month of January are roughly \$9.1M. Labor and Fringe Benefits, the largest expenditure at \$6.9M, comprised 75.3% of this month's actual expenses. In total, Operating Expenses for the month of January show a decrease of 2.3% from \$9.3M in December.



Operating Reserve

The negative variance that resulted from Net Revenue (After Government Assistance of approximately \$1.7M) reduced the Restricted Operating/Capital Reserve by \$2.1M, after the offset of \$5.1M in Debt Service.

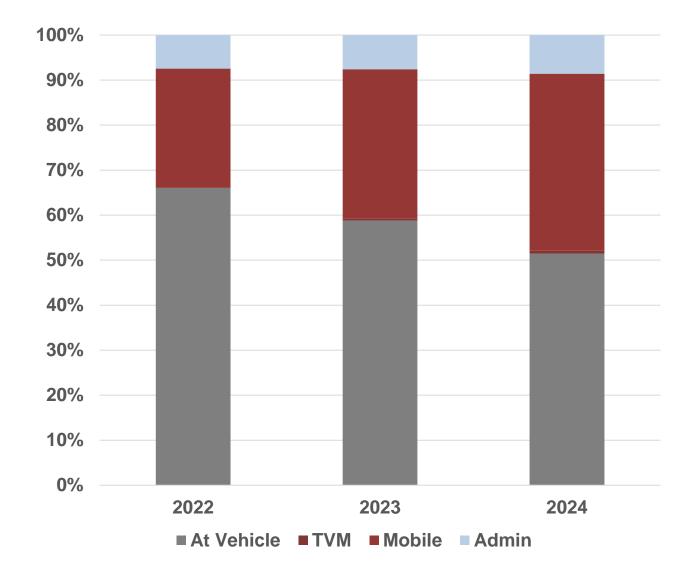

Pre-paid sales (TVM, Mobile, Admin) nearly 50% of gross revenue in 2024



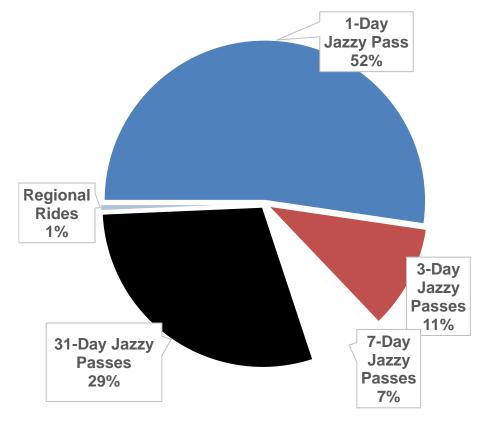
