RECOMMENDATION:

To support the community and the Louisiana delegation in its endeavors to designate the Dr. Rudy Lombard Ferry Terminal as the new name for the Algiers Ferry Terminal.

ISSUE/BACKGROUND:

Dr. Rudy Lombard was a prominent civil rights activist who lived in Algiers. Dr. Lombard died in 2014 at the age of 75. He was a Freedom Rider who helped organize the lunch counter sit-in at the McCrory's five-and-dime on Canal Street, demanding to be served at the whites-only lunch counter. He is also known for his work partnering with local churches to educate African American men about their high cancer risk.

The community including Congressman Troy Carter and State Representative Delisha Boyd have recently approached the RTA about changing the name of the Algiers Ferry Terminal. The Congressman testified on the House Floor recently <u>Congressman Troy A. Carter, Sr. on renaming the Algiers Ferry Terminal for Dr. Rudy Lombard https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=J1mChKDePdA. <u>DISCUSSION:</u></u>

The RTA entered a CEA with the State of Louisiana to operate the ferry system in 2014, the agency has use of the property and does not own the property. Since the property is owned by the State of Louisiana, the agency does not have the authority to change the name, however we can support the community's efforts by issuing a letter of support to this cause.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The cost impact is minimal for the agency since there is a renovation project in design and the signage can be replaced during this time.

NEXT STEPS:

Once approved, the resolution of support will be sent to the relevant authorities.

WHEREAS, the RTA Board of Directors recognizes the importance of aligning the terminal's name with the community's evolving identity and values while honoring distinguished individuals or reflecting the geographic and cultural significance of the region; and

WHEREAS, the proposal to rename the Algiers Ferry Terminal as the Dr. Rudy Lombard Ferry Terminal seeks to celebrate Dr. Lombard's extraordinary commitment to racial justice and equality in the Greater New Orleans area; and

Dear Board Members of the New Orleans Regional Transit Authority,

I hope this letter finds you well. I am writing to propose the renaming of the Algiers Ferry and its Terminals to the Dr. Rudy Lombard Ferry and Dr Rudy Lombard Terminal in honor of Dr. Rudolph "Rudy" Lombard, a remarkable figure in our community and a pivotal leader in the Civil Rights Movement.

As you may be aware Congressman Carter began this journey three years ago when he became a member of Congress, as he explored naming the Algiers Post office in Dr. Rudy Lombard's honor. After consultation with the Lombard family preferred this Ferry landing as a more fitting honor.

Mass transit has played a significant role in advancing civil rights, and the Algiers Ferry is particularly essential for Algiers residents, especially within the Black community. As a State Representative, I have pre-filed a bill to rename the route between Algiers and Canal Street and its terminals after Dr. Lombard. This initiative is supported by and in collaboration of State Senator Gary Carter and our entire Algiers delegation.

Dr. Lombard was born in Algiers in 1939 and is celebrated for his unwavering commitment to civil rights, education, and community advocacy. His early experiences with racial discrimination inspired him to become an activist. Notably, as a student at Xavier University, he led a historic sit-in at the McCroy's Five & Dime store, protesting Jim Crow laws alongside the influential "CORE Four" and members of SNCC. Their actions not only challenged segregation but also played a crucial role in shaping legal precedents that advanced civil rights.

Renaming the Algiers Ferry Terminal in Dr. Lombard's honor would serve as a fitting tribute to his legacy and the ongoing struggle for equality. I envision clear signage at each terminal to commemorate this change, ensuring that both residents and visitors recognize the significance of this route and the impact of Dr. Lombard's work.

Thank you for considering this important request to honor Dr. Lombard's legacy. I look forward to collaborating with you to make this recognition a reality.

Dear Vice-Chairman Walton:

Since I joined the U.S. Congress, I have sought to honor Dr. Rudy Lombard in recognition of his legacy as a champion of civil rights. As part of this, I sought to designate the United States Postal Service facility located at 3901 MacArthur Blvd, in New Orleans, Louisiana, as the "Dr. Rudy Lombard Post Office." Simultaneously, I have been exploring the renaming of the Algiers Ferry. After consultation with Dr. Lombard's family, I am suspending my efforts to rename that postal facility. Given the significance of mass transit to the civil rights movement and the importance of the Algiers Ferry for Algiers residents, particularly black residents, I request that the RTA rename the route between Algiers and Canal Street and its terminals after Dr. Lombard and provide signage at each terminal designating it as such. The millions of dollars in federal investment I fought to provide for these facilities have transformed this route into a fitting tribute for Dr. Lombard at the foot of Canal Street.

Dr. Rudolph "Rudy" Lombard was born in the Algiers neighborhood in 1939. He is remembered as a New Orleans icon for his work as a Civil Rights Hero, educator, and lifelong community advocate. He grew up witnessing widespread discrimination against Black New Orleanians, and his early life experience prompted him to become an activist. As a college student at Xavier University, Lombard famously led a sit-in at the McCroy's Five & Dime store in protest of Jim Crow laws. Joining him in these protests were the "CORE Four," Lanny Goldfincy, Cecil Carter, Jr., Jerome "Big Duck" Smith, Oretha Castle Haley, and other members of SNCC. Their case made its way to the Supreme Court in 1963, and after review, their criminal mischief arrests were tossed out. This was one of several cases that became a precedent for striking down segregation laws and practices.

Thank you for considering this request in honoring Dr. Lombard's legacy. I look forward to working with you to make this recognition come true.








TOTAL RIDERSHIP - BUS, STREETCAR, PARATRANSIT & FERRY




BUS & STREETCAR RIDERSHIP | OCTOBER 2024










TOP ON-TIME PERFORMER BY MODE













OTP, RIDERSHIP, & SERVICE DELIVERY COMPARISON ROUTES 3 – 66 OTP %








BUS FLEET AVAILABILITY: For November, the Agency saw an increase by 2 in the number of available buses from the prior month.




PARATRANSIT FLEET AVAILABILITY: Paratransit availability increased by 4 from the previous month.





STREETCAR FLEET AVAILABILITY: Streetcar availability remained the same on both the Red and Green cars for the month of November.








ROAD CALL MILEAGE: Fixed Route bus road calls per 100,000 miles have decreased by 1.74 from the previous month with the goal still set at under 13.









1. Preventability rate = number of collisions deemed preventable based on agency standards per 100,000 revenue miles per mode. RTA's current goals are <2.3 for streetcar and <1.5 for bus and paratransit.

Agency Safety Plan Overview


• (Effective July 2020) a transit agency must establish a Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan that meets FTA requirements. [§673.11(a)]



- The Plan must be reviewed and updated annually. It must be approved by the Accountable Executive and the agency's Board of Directors, or equivalent. [§673.11(a)(1) and §673.11(a)(5)]
- The Plan: defines roles and responsibilities for safety, establishes an employee safety reporting program, sets specific safety performance targets, and outlines formal procedures for identifying hazards and assessing and mitigating safety risk.
- The Plan covers safety training requirements, continuous improvement, safety audits, inspections, safety communication, and safety committees.




Annual ASP Review Cycle





Current Draft Revision Highlights

- Roles and responsibilities for safety and the SMS reflecting RTA's current organizational chart
- Safety Committee responsibilities and procedures
- Safety Risk Reduction Program and related targets (must be set by the Safety Committee)
- Consideration of 2 consequences specified by FTA as part of the Safety Risk Reduction Program: collisions with pedestrians and vehicles; and assaults on transit workers
- SMS training requirements for staff, senior/executive leadership, and Safety Committee members
- Revised notification thresholds for streetcar safety events
- Added Risk-Based Inspections per FTA regulatory changes
