FINANCE COMMITTEE MINUTES THURSDAY, JANUARY 14, 2021 1:00 PM

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 11:02 a.m.
- 2. Roll Call: A quorum was confirmed.

3. Consideration: Minutes December 3, 2020

Commissioner Tillery moved and Commissioner Walton seconded to approve the minutes of the December 3, 2020 meeting. Verbal Motion was adopted unanimously.

4. Consideration: Committee Chairman's Report

Chairman Raymond stated that the RTA had a hectic and chaotic year filled with different crisis, but the RTA managed to put two ferries into service and received over \$60 Million in grant funding.

Chairman Raymond stated that the RTA had a roundtable discussion with Dr. Corey Hebert on COVID-19.

Alex Wiggins reported that the RTA received a second round of COVID-19 funding totally \$26 Million.

Chairman Daniels thanked Alex Wiggins and his team for doing a great job and the Board along with staff wanted to make sure employees had the necessary PPE's to protect employees and the riding public.

5. Consideration: RTA's Chief Executive Officer's Report

Alex Wiggins reported that the roundtable with Chairman Daniels and Dr. Herbert was to help make the employees comfortable about the COVID-19 vaccine.

Alex Wiggins reported that the RTA transition over 700 employees to the agencies and there were a few issues with financial information and some employees didn't get their benefits uploaded but the union worked with staff through to resolve all the issues.

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Alex Wiggins reported that the City of New Orleans went back into Phase I and the RTA was going to continue to maintain operations at the current levels and current ridership was holding steady.

Alex Wiggins reported that the RTA received \$26 Million from the 2nd round of the CARES Act funding and at the January Board Meeting staff would give the Board a breakdown of funding.

6. Consideration: Financial Statements - November

Gizelle Banks reported that the Operating Revenues for the month of November was budgeted at \$6.1 Million, Year to Date \$68.2 Million which presents a variance of about \$29 Million.

Ms. Banks reported that Operating Expenses were at \$9.2 Million, Year to Date still under Budget \$3.7 Million, Maritime Operations was \$12 Million and some of the CARES Act Funding was used to fill in the gaps. Government Assistance was \$48.9 Million and Year to Date a positive \$8.7 Million before debt services.

Gizelle Banks further reported that the RTA Debt Expenditures was \$9 Million and the rate on the bond expenses was about \$12 Million and the RTA did recognize the savings which brings the bottom line to a positive \$9.6 Million year to date.

Alex Wiggins reported that staff was very close to wrapping up the contract with Labmar and the RTA had double its fleet regarding the ferry.

7. Consideration: Procurement Items:

A. Authorization to Amend Canal Street Ferry Terminal Project

In response to Commissioner Walton, Lona Hankins stated that the Jackson Avenue Barge had more damage than realized and to repair the stair tower and the balance system was very expensive and by repairing these items it would extend the life of the barge and the project was financed by multiple grants including local and state funding.

Commissioner Wegner moved and Commissioner Walton seconded to approve the **Canal Street Ferry Terminal Project**. Verbal Motion was approved unanimously.

Alex Wiggins reported that the RTA was going to conduct a study to right size the RTA fares and maintain affordability for the riders in the region and discussions were beginning on the Hotel/Motel Sales Tax.
